Angie and Tom live near Fond du Lac, Wisconsin and also perform as the Otte Family Band which includes all three of their children. They each have a long history of musical theater and playing in a variety of bands. This concert features Angie's vocal harmonies and Tom's talents on upright bass to go along with KG's banjo and harmonica and Ranger Rick's rhythm guitar.
